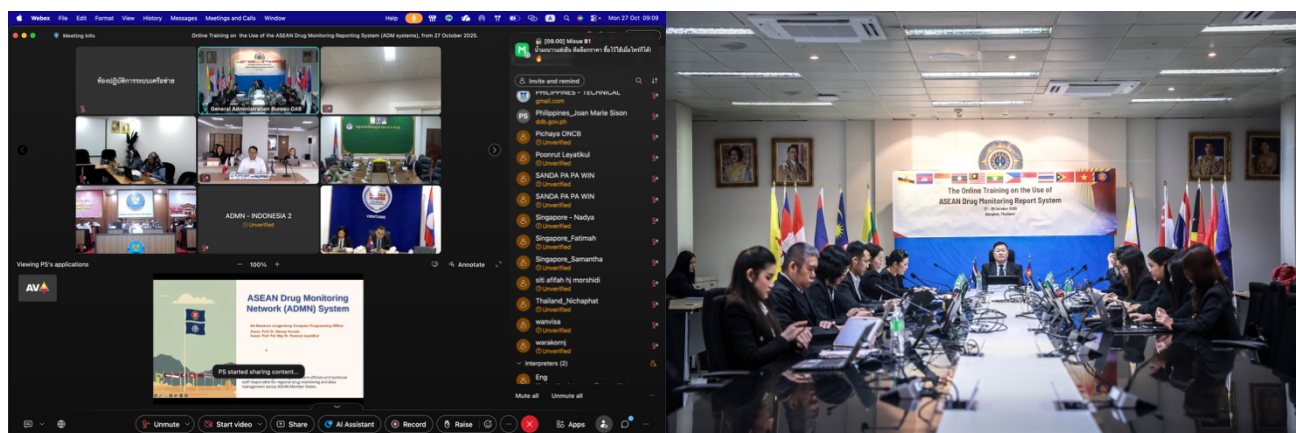




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ADMN Thailand Conducts Training on the ASEAN Drug Monitoring Report System



The Office of the Narcotics Control Board organized the Online Training on the Use of ASEAN Drug Monitoring Report System on 27-28 October 2025. Pol. Maj. Suriya Singhagamol, Secretary-General of the Narcotics Control Board, NCB, assigned Mr. Apikit Ch.rojprasert, Deputy Secretary-General of NCB, to preside over the opening ceremony of the Online Training on the use of ASEAN Drug Monitoring Report System (ADM Report System) at ONCB Headquarters, Bangkok, on Monday, 27 October 2025. Prior to the opening remarks, the Deputy Secretary-General invited all participants to observe a moment of silence in remembrance of Her Majesty Queen Sirikit, the Queen Mother.



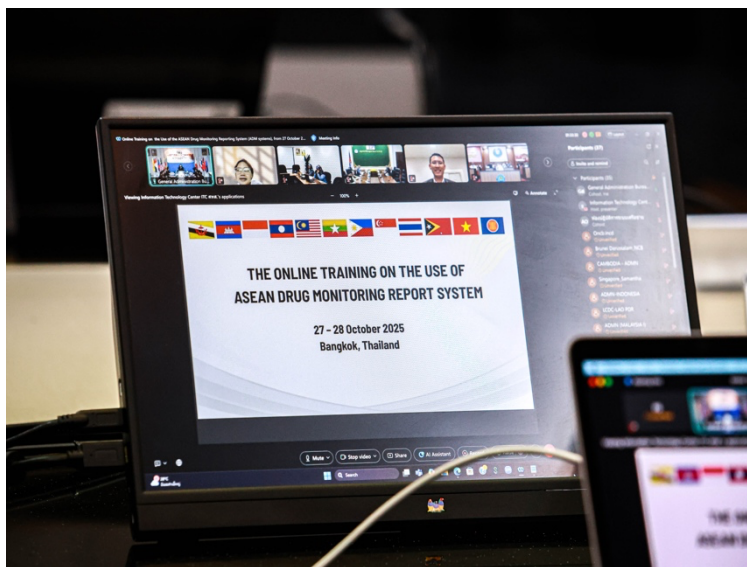
The event was attended by ONCB executives, along with members of ADMN from ASEAN Member States, both onsite and online.



The training was organized in accordance with one of the outcomes of the 19th Meeting of the ASEAN Drug Monitoring Network (ADMN), hosted by Thailand. The training aims to support the upgraded ADM Report System, with its newly added functions, and to ensure that national focal points, particularly newly assigned personnel, gain the necessary understanding and skills to operate the system effectively and accurately.



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In his opening remarks, the Deputy Secretary-General underscored the significant milestone of the 10th anniversary of ASEAN-NARCO and the ADMN Network. He expressed appreciation for the continued cooperation of ASEAN Member States in contributing high-quality data to the ADM Report System, recognizing it as a vital mechanism for producing internationally recognized and evidence-based ADM Reports.

The two-day training, held from 27 to 28 October 2025, included both technical lectures and practical exercises on the ADM Report System. Sessions aim to strengthen participants' understanding of report structures, data definitions, data entry related to supply and demand indicators, as well as data validation prior to submission. The program also provided the opportunity for participants to share experiences, challenges, and recommendations that will support the continuous development of the ADM Report System to better serve the needs of all ASEAN Member States.

In addition, the training also featured a module on the ASEAN-NARCO Website, which aims to enhance the ability of ASEAN Member States to contribute to and publicize drug-related information efficiently through digital platforms. This will further reinforce regional cooperation and effective information-sharing under the ASEAN-NARCO framework.
