

# THE BRIEFING ON THE DATA SYSTEMS UNDER THE ASEAN-NARCO FRAMEWORK

2 July 2026, via Video Conference, Bangkok, Thailand



On Thursday, 2 July, 2026, the Briefing on the Data Systems under the ASEAN-NARCO Framework was organized by Thailand via video conference. The Office of the Narcotics Control Board (ONCB) organized the online briefing with the participation of representatives from all eleven ASEAN Member States who were the ASEAN Drug Monitoring Network (ADMN) Team and the ASEAN Airport Interdiction (AAITF) Team as well as representative of the ASEAN Secretariat. The briefing was aimed to enhance participants' understanding on data entry procedures and promote standardized information sharing through their respective information system on drug-related issues and drug seizures at the international airports.

The briefing emphasized the importance of accurate and timely data in supporting drug trend analysis, monitoring emerging new psychoactive substances, identifying trafficking methods, and strengthening early warning systems. Participants received an overview of the ASEAN Drug Monitoring Network (ADMN) System and the ASEAN Airport Interdiction Task Force (AAITF) Information System.





In her opening remarks, Ms. Rachanikorn Sarasiri , Advisor to the ONCB in her capacity of Director of ASEAN-NARCO as Chair, emphasized the importance of the ADM Report System and AAITF Information System in supporting information sharing and regional cooperation among ASEAN Member States. She highlighted the need for accurate and timely data to strengthen drug trend monitoring and enable effective responses to emerging drug threats as well as illicit drug trafficking across the ASEAN region.



The briefing also discussed updates to the AAITF Information System which served as the central data base on the interdiction of drug at the international airports of ASEAN Member States. The data compiling in the AAITF Information System would be beneficial to the information sharing on drug seizures, method of concealment, trafficking routes for further intelligence analysis, monitoring trend of illicit drug trafficking trend by air route. The briefing also followed up the changes in national focal points who played the key role in data input into the System of ASEAN Member States. AAITF members agreed to update the list of national focal points and responsible officers and send to the ONCB as Secretariat of the AAITF. The ONCB, as the AAITF Information System administrator, would provide access credentials to newly designated users of each ASEAN Member State to ensure the continuous data input into the AAITF Information System and to strengthen regional information sharing and cooperation in drug interdiction efforts.
